#### The BIOEAST SRIA

The BIOEAST Vision for 2030 paves the way for the comprehensive BIOEAST Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA). The SRIA will provide relevant and high-quality strategic research policy advice in the evolving land-scape of the broader bioeconomy and related sectors in the key BIOEAST thematic areas:

- Agroecology and Sustainable Yields
- Food Systems
- Bioenergy and New Value-added Materials
- Advanced Biochemical and Biomaterials
- Forestry Value Chains
- Freshwater-based Bioeconomy
- Bioeconomy Education

The BIOEAST Initiative has developed the draft of the BIOEAST SRIA within the frame of the BIOEASTsUP project and BIOEAST thematic working groups involvement The SRIA will provide the Member States and the European institutions with strategic research and innovation program to support a knowledge-driven bioeconomy in the BIOEAST macro-region.



#### **SRIA Validation: expected outcomes**

In line with the bottom-up approach for the SRIA development, the feedback of national stakeholders will be provided by validating the second draft of the SRIA in sub-regional workshops. Three workshops will be organised in the BIOEAST sub-regions:

- Warsaw /Poland/ for Central and Eastern Europe (CEE);
- Tartu /Estonia/ for the Baltic States:
- Ljubljana /Slovenia/ for South Eastern Europe (SEE).

During the workshops, discussion groups will be organised on each thematic area and feedback received will be taken into account for the final preparation of the BIOEAST SRIA. The objective is to discuss special challenges the macro-region might face with, and the ultimate aim is to contribute to the development of the BIOEAST Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda.

Discussion will focus on: goals and challenges, main research topics, expected outcomes and impact for better addressing research and innovation needs for the BIOEAST macro-region.
