








Current RDP measures for bioeconomy

Sustainable bioeconomy value chains can contribute to rural development

Koppány Valley Local Action Group, HU

- Local challenges: soil erosion, rural poverty, depopulation
- Solution: innovative processing unit combining biogas and plant protein extraction
- Step 1: Add value to ecological buffer strips on fields planting Galega (protein) and Silphium Perfoliatum (energy)
- Step 2: After environmental function, cut plants for energy and protein
- Step 3: Electricity and heat from biogas plant for households & for plant protein extraction
- Step 4: Digestate used to improve soil quality & plant protein as fodder in local poultry business to replace imported soy

Result: Helps over 100 families

→ Would be too simplistic to call this a bioenergy project!


