Ministers reaffirmed their commitment to fostering cooperation and establishing a joint partnership based on research and innovation that addresses key challenges in the field of knowledge-based agriculture, aquaculture and forestry in the bioeconomy.

Today's conference is a further step forward in strong and ambitious cooperation in research and innovation, opening up a space for dialogue, sharing experiences, identifying challenges and building concrete solutions.

In the upcoming Polish presidency of the EU Council, which we will take over on 1 January 2025, we will emphasize the role of research, innovation and digitization in increasing the competitiveness of all areas of European agriculture and ensuring food security.

A high-level conference will be organized at June 2025, Warsaw.

The event will be organized in cooperation with the European Commission, the Standing Committee on Agricultural Research (SCAR) and the BIOEAST initiative.

The conference under the Polish Presidency will serve as a key scientific and policy platform to define and address the most pressing challenges in sustainable food systems, the digital and green transformation of the agrifood sector, and the development of the bioeconomy in the BIOEAST region and Central and Eastern Europe and the EU. In this context, the conclusions of the today's Hungarian conference will be discussed, which will contribute to set up further actions in this regard.

I wish you fruitful deliberations, inspiring discussions and new ideas that will contribute to the success of the BIOEAST initiative – not only today, but also in the future. Once again, I thank the hosts for their hospitality and commitment, and all the participants for coming and contributing to this important initiative.
