Introduction to the project

BOOST4BIOEAST is a Coordination and Support Action funded by the European Commission developed to support the BIOEAST Initiative with the aim of empowering national stakeholders in the Central Eastern European and Baltic countries for the development of national bioeconomy action plans and to build long-lasting structures and spaces of dialogue for national and macro-regional cooperation. The project will enrich knowledge on the bioeconomy and stimulate related research and innovation across the macro-region.

1 Introduction

The first **BIOEAST Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA)**, published in 2023, was aimed to be a living document updated every three years through a collective, forward-looking revision exercise. **Updating the SRIA** involves several key steps that are all interconnected. The process must be **open and inclusive**, involving relevant bioeconomy stakeholders, such as policymakers, researchers, bio-based industries, farmers' associations, and citizens from the start. This **collaborative approach** ensures a better **alignment with stakeholder needs** and, therefore, a higher level of **acceptance and commitment** on their part.

2 Key steps of the SRIA update process

- **Establishing a Core Team**

A dedicated team will be formed to steer the SRIA update process, comprising key members of the B4B consortium / the BIOEAST Initiative. (TTK, ÖMKI, BME, MKGP)

- **Contextualization**

Taking the 1st BIOEAST SRIA as a basis, R&I trends, gaps, policy goals, and existing initiatives will be analysed and updated to frame the Initiative's contribution and refine priority areas.

- **Updating the 7 Core Themes**

Facilitated by TWG and HUB Coordinators and with a high level of stakeholder involvement, the BIOEAST Initiative's R&I agenda is updated in an iterative process through a series of online consultations, workshops, and drafts.

- **Validation and Adoption**

The updated and aligned Core Themes (**Thematic SRIAs**) will be validated by experts and finalised based on their feedback. The Core Themes will form the backbone of the updated BIOEAST-level SRIA, reviewed by the BIOEAST Board before publication.

- **Communication**

Contact with relevant EU and national actors will be established and maintained, keeping them informed of the process to influence bioeconomy-related policies. Once the updated SRIA is adopted, significant launch and publication events will publicise the document and maximise its impact.

- **Keeping SRIA up-to-date**

Regular updates of the BIOEAST SRIA will be performed every 3 years beyond BOOST4BIOEAST. The simplified update process will be centred around updating the 7 Thematic SRIAs, driven by the TWG Coordinators in communication with the BIOEAST Board.

Stage 1 – Management and communication

A **Core Team** composed of key members of the BOOST4BIOEAST consortium (TTK, BME, ÖMKI, MKGP) will be set up as a **temporary working group** by **2024-05** to facilitate an effective and efficient SRIA update process.

Manage the SRIA update process

- The Core Team will be in charge of steering the process
- Design the **methodology** and timeframe
- Drive **implementation** of the update process
- Draft the **state-of-the-art** section of the Updated SRIA.

Communicate with relevant actors

- Establish and maintain contact with relevant EU and national actors
- Keep stakeholders informed of the process
- **Maximise potential impact** on bioeconomy-related policies

Disseminate the Updated SRIA

Once the Updated SRIA is adopted, significant launch and publication events will be held involving the broad stakeholder community to publicise the document and further consolidate stakeholder buy-in and commitment.

- The **BOOST4BIOEAST Final Conference** will be a crucial dissemination event in **2026-11**.

Stage 2 – Contextualisation

*Contextualisation is a crucial element of the SRIA update process. The **state-of-the-art** surrounding the bioeconomy in the BIOEAST macro-region, as well as **ongoing and future developments**, will be monitored and analysed regarding R&I trends and drivers, gaps and opportunities, national and European policy goals, and complementary activities and initiatives. The above information will be summarised in **periodic updates** provided to TWGs **every 6 months** to support the development of Thematic SRIAs.*

Stage 3 – Review and update thematic areas

***Overdue thematic areas** of the 7 Core Themes and **new strategic directions** will be identified. This phase is at the core of the SRIA update process, defining and revising the BIOEAST Initiative's R&I agenda.*

Review process

- Each TWG will organise at least **1 macro-regional online workshop** by **2025-02**, focusing on identifying any overdue thematic areas in the SRIA prepared during the BIOEASTsUP project and considering **new or missing strategic directions**.
- Subsequently, TWG coordinators will recommend removing, revising, or adding thematic areas at the macro-regional level by **2025-05**.

Stage 4 – National consultations on research priorities

Responsible	Start	Due
National HUBs	2024-11	2025-07

*At the national level, a series of **consultations with national Mirror Groups** will be conducted by the **BIOEAST HUBs** in local languages. These consultations build on the thematic areas updated in Stage 3 to conceptualise the new, relevant research priorities and themes that will form the backbone of the updated Thematic SRIAs.*

Consultation process

- The consultation process will be announced at the **HUB kick-off** events by **2024-11**.
- An **online survey** developed by the Core Team will be provided to the HUBs by **2024-11**.
- The HUBs are responsible for **translating the survey** into local languages by **2025-01**.
- **Stakeholder responses** will be collected through mirror groups by **2025-03**.
- The responses will be discussed in **national-level workshops** by the HUBs in **2025-06**.
- The outcomes of the national consultations will be communicated to TWGs by **2025-07**.

Stage 5 – Explore synergies across updated thematic SRIAs

*To further refine the research priorities, **synergistic research topics** across the updated Thematic SRIAs will be identified and their effect estimated.*

Identification of synergies

- Considering the inputs collected in these national consultations, each TWG will organise at least **1 macro-regional online workshop** to find synergistic research topics across the updated thematic SRIAs by **2025-10**.
- Based on the outcomes of these workshops, TWG coordinators will **analyse the potential benefits** of such synergies and prepare **updated thematic SRIAs** accordingly through an iterative process and continuous consultation with members by **2025-12**.

Stage 6 – Align thematic SRIAs with national Action Plans

The alignment process will ensure that the Thematic SRIAs are focused on supporting the implementation of the Action Plans and facilitating research and innovation efforts that are relevant and applicable to the needs of the bioeconomy. Best models of supporting investments within the bioeconomy towards the adoption of bio-based solutions will be identified.

Alignment of Updated SRIA and Action Plans

- TTK will perform a **sense-making analysis** to reveal common patterns and themes in the Updated Thematic SRIAs and national Action Plans by **2026-02**.
- Based on the insights provided by this analysis, **HUB and TWG Coordinators** will review the Action Plans and thematic SRIAs to identify common objectives and interlinkages, synergies and potential gaps or discrepancies that should be addressed at a national or macro-regional level by **2026-03**.

Relevant BOOST4BIOEAST activities

- 4CF will organise an in-person **cross-fertilisation workshop** in **2025-12** to enable TWG and HUB Coordinators to exchange knowledge and ideas and compare perspectives. The results will be fed into both the Action Plans & SRIAs, necessitating correlation and a continuous exchange of information with **Task 6.2**.

Stage 7 – Validate Updated Thematic SRIAs

The **Updated Thematic SRIAs**, as key strategy documents of BIOEAST for decision-making, will be formally validated through **internal & external consultations** before finalising them.

Validation process

- The updated and aligned Thematic SRIAs will be validated through **3 Online Regional Webinars** (TTK, AA, VMU) between **2026-03** and **2026-05**, where the feedback of broader stakeholder groups will be considered.
- TWG Coordinators will be involved in the organisation and promotion of these events.

Stage 8 – Develop the updated BIOEAST SRIA

Based on the feedback collected in the validation process, the **Core Team**, in collaboration with **TWG Coordinators**, will finalise the **7 Thematic SRIAs** (collected and described in D6.1). As **Core Themes**, these will be consolidated into the updated **BIOEAST-level SRIA** (D6.2).

The Updated SRIA must be kept relevant beyond the 3-year duration of the BOOST4BIOEAST project. A **streamlined procedure** will be developed for regular updates as an integral part of the SRIA document. Updates will be performed **every 3 years**, centred around updating the 7 Thematic SRIAs, driven by the TWG Coordinators in communication with the BIOEAST Board.

Finalisation of the updated BIOEAST SRIA

- The Core Team and TWGs will finalise the **7 validated Thematic SRIAs** by **2026-07**.
- The final Thematic SRIAs will be integrated as **Core Themes** into the Updated BIOEAST SRIA, detailing policy considerations for each country and the macro-region by **2026-09**.
- The **BIOEAST Board** will review the updated BIOEAST-level SRIA by **2026-10**.
- The **Updated BIOEAST SRIA** will be published at the **final BIOEAST Bioeconomy Conference** (**2026-11**) and submitted as **Deliverable 6.2** by **2026-12**.

Ensure that the SRIA is kept up-to-date

- The **Core Team** will be in discussion with **TWG Coordinators** to design a simplified procedure for the 3-yearly iterative updates.
- Regular updates are expected to be **driven by TWG Coordinators** in a **rotational system**, with one TWG responsible for the process each time.
- A **streamlined process for regular updates** will be incorporated into the Updated BIOEAST SRIA by **2026-12**.

5 Outlook

Ultimately, the success of the Updated BIOEAST SRIA hinges on our collective commitment to adaptability, cooperation, and forward-thinking, ensuring that it serves as a robust and visionary guide for the sustainable development of the bioeconomy in Central and Eastern Europe.
