# ANNUAL BIOEAST BIOECONOMY CONFERENCE

Join us in refreshing macro-regional research & innovation priorities for Central and Eastern Europe

9th - 10th April 2025

In the past years, the BIOEAST Initiative has been instrumental in mobilizing the Central and Eastern European (CEE) macro-region to align its efforts with EU policies, enabling a more coordinated approach to complex issues such as climate change, food security, and resource efficiency. Central to this effort is the further **development and periodic revision of the BIOEAST Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA)** of 2022 implemented by the BOOST4BIOEAST project (supporting project of the BIOEAST Initiative), a document that presents the macro-region's bioeconomy-related research and innovation (R&I) priorities while addressing macro-regional needs and opportunities. To contribute to the renewal of the BIOEAST SRIA in an inclusive way by bringing together the BIOEAST community, **the BOOST4BIOEAST project organises its flagship annual event, the BIOEAST Bioeconomy Conference on 9-10 April 2025, in Bucharest, Romania.** 

While <u>last year's Conference</u> centered around the establishment and strengthening of the national BIOEAST HUBs (national networks and communities of bioeconomy), this year the event will revolve around assessing the above mentioned macro-regional strategic R&I directions, identifying research and knowledge gaps, and setting the course for further progress later the year.

**Specific objectives** of the conference are:

- to overview the latest updates from the BIOEAST Initiative in the context of ongoing European and upcoming EU presidency priorities,
- to showcase **how to build a SRIA** from research management point of view,
- to discuss **preliminary results of the BOOST4BIOEAST** project relevant for the SRIA update process and reflect on its policy implications,
- to foster discussions on CEE-specific R&I priorities and **engage wide-range of stakeholders to review the BIOEAST SRIA** and propose revisions reflecting emerging challenges and opportunities through **thematic interactive sessions**.

The event will also offer opportunities for **networking and knowledge-sharing**, **with a poster session** dedicated to inspiring bioeconomy examples and projects from the BIOEAST countries or relevant for the BIOEAST macro-region and a **field trip** showcasing practical applications of bioeconomy.

The **expected outcomes of the conference are both strategic and practical**. By engaging stakeholders in reviewing and updating the SRIA, the conference will help align regional R&I priorities with EU strategies, thereby strengthening the role of the CEE macro-region in the European bioeconomy landscape. It will also foster stronger networks among stakeholders leading to collaborations that can drive practice-oriented bioeconomy projects.







The Conference is **part of a series of events**, organized back-to-back with the meetings of the BIOEAST Board, Thematic Working Groups Coordination and BOOST4BIOEAST annual project meeting making the week between 7-10 April specifically dedicated to BIOEAST in Bucharest.

The BIOEAST Board, Thematic Working Groups, national networks, and communities of bioeconomy (BIOEAST HUBS, mirror groups, etc.), research and innovation funders, Horizon Europe Programme Committee members and National Contact Points of the BIOEAST countries are all invited to take part in the conference and its side-events.

The conference is primarily dedicated to the bioeconomy stakeholders of the BIOEAST macro-region, but it welcomes any interested parties from all EU countries.
