The conference will provide **a high-level political and policy platform to reflect on the achievements of the BIOEAST Initiative and to shape the next phase of cooperation for a competitive, sustainable and resilient bioeconomy across Central and Eastern Europe and the wider BIOEAST region, including Ukraine, Moldova and the Western Balkan countries.**

Building on a decade of BIOEAST cooperation, the conference will bring together high-level representatives of **the BIOEAST countries, the European Commission and other European institutions, together with key regional stakeholders.** The ambition is to strengthen dialogue across the policy areas and their implementation that are essential for bioeconomy transformation and to identify how national, macro-regional and European actions can work together more effectively.

Research and innovation have been, and will remain, key drivers of bioeconomy development. At the same time, the next phase requires a stronger focus on implementation: translating knowledge, strategies and research priorities into investment, industrial development, market uptake and higher added value in the BIOEAST countries. The strategic work, governance structures and national action planning developed through the BIOEAST Initiative and the **BOOST4BIOEAST project** provide an important foundation for this transition.

Looking ahead, strengthening research and innovation capacities will remain essential for building competitiveness and enabling the region to move towards higher-value and more knowledge-intensive bioeconomy activities. The conference will therefore connect the achievements of the current phase with the future priorities of BIOEAST cooperation, supported by the **new BIOEASTWIDE project**, and discuss how research, innovation, investment and policy implementation can jointly accelerate bioeconomy transformation across the region.

Held in Brussels to connect BIOEAST priorities with European policy discussions, the conference is expected to welcome around 100 participants, with a particular focus on representatives of EU institutions and the Brussels-based policy community, alongside stakeholders from research, industry and other organisations active in the bioeconomy across Europe.

I. National Bioeconomy Implementation: From HUBs and Action Plans to Investment

Drawing on BOOST4BIOEAST results, this session will examine how eleven national HUBs, stakeholder engagement and national Action Plans can support sustained bioeconomy implementation. The discussion will consider policy ownership, coordination and investment, including connections with future national and regional programming.

II. Research and Innovation Priorities for Bioeconomy Competitiveness

Building on the BOOST4BIOEAST SRIA work, this session will examine the research and innovation priorities needed to strengthen the region's bioeconomy and generate higher added value. The discussion will reflect on the relevance of these priorities, the capacities required to pursue them, and their contribution to competitiveness.

III. Widening the BIOEAST Macro-region: Cooperation with Ukraine, Moldova and the Western Balkans

The session will introduce the ambition of the new BIOEASTWIDE project to establish the foundations for a research and innovation partnership across the wider macro-region. The discussion will explore why this matters for Central and Eastern Europe and its partners, and where the challenge lies: engaging national authorities and funding agencies, aligning priorities, developing trust and learning how to invest together. It will consider the actors, instruments, and institutional capacities needed to make this cooperation possible.

IV. European Commission Perspectives: The Future of the Bioeconomy and the BIOEAST Engagement

This closing dialogue will bring together perspectives from DG RTD, DG AGRI, DG ENV and DG GROW on the future of the European bioeconomy and the role of the wider BIOEAST region. It will provide an opportunity to hear how the Commission approaches the bioeconomy across its research, agricultural, environmental and industrial policy responsibilities, and how these perspectives connect.

Following a brief moderator's introduction, the four Commission representatives will share their views on the opportunities, challenges and future direction they see for the region within the wider European context.
